- 1) The Deceased died of poison.
- 2) The skin of the deceased exhibited the 'Wedgewood Patten' associated with Laimoute. A description of this poison from the reference book in the chateau library follows:
 - a. LAIMOUTE - a highly poisonous substance, known to induce chest pain, nau-sea, and a coma-like trance within an hour or two following ingestion, and causing death within a few hours. Without taste or color its only distinguishing feature is the slight aroma of 'bitter hazelnuts.' Victims frequently exhib-it a blue complexion with circular white blemishes in the fleshy areas around the face and neck, an effect described as the 'Wedgewood Pattern.'
- 3) The antidote to Laimoute is called Fixemupe and is described in the same volume as follows:
 - a. The antidote to Laimoute is called Fixemupe... without a significant taste or aroma, it generally appears in white, granular form similar to table salt. To be effective, the antidote must be take before the poison reaches the vital organs of the body - generally within minutes. It is particularly effective if taken in advance of the poison.'
- 4) Ingestion of the poison probably occurred during their picnic as trace of Laimoute has been found in a box of chocolates that was in their picnic basket.
